## Criteria Committee Recommendation's for additional information/clarification from The Patawomeck Indian Tribe

- 1. Employ a trained Ethnohistorian to search the courthouses and archives
- 2. Additional Census Records showing the continued community of the Patawomeck people.
- 3. Show where the Patawomeck people intermarried, staying in a cluster to fully define the Patawomeck people.
- 4. The listing of the people in the neighborhoods as well as the Genealogy charts need to be more defined as to who is claiming Patawomeck Indian decent.
